RVS Trustee report for School council

September

RVS ENROLMENT

While official enrolment numbers will not be submitted to Alberta Education until Sept. 30, preliminary enrolment numbers indicate RVS' student population is expected to grow to 29,350 by Sept. 30, and increase from last year of approximately 750 students for the 2024/25 school year. This enrolment growth is being driven by population growth in many of the communities served by RVS. As of Sept. 4, RVS enrolment is 29,307 students, an increase of 700 students from September of 2023. NEW SCHOOLS

The high school site in Chestermere (Chelsea) is READY as confirmed by the City of Chestermere. The school division will be able to request construction funding in spring of 2025. The province has confirmed that high schools will be built under a P3 model and that the build time is between 4-5 years. The K-9 school site in Dawson's Landing has received Design funding and is on track to be site ready by the end of this calendar year. There are several school sites in various stages of readiness. The municipal council has committed to keeping school site readiness a priority as these two sites are not nearly enough to keep pace with growth. MODULARS

Modulars, or portables, are used as way to bridge the gap between building capacity and building utilization. Until new schools are opened, modulars are a necessary addition to RVS schools. RVS received 10 modulars in the spring allocation, 5 more as surplus units from Drayton Valley. Over the summer we also received 12 more modulars and approval to move 12 more. There are a few modulars throughout RVS that can be repurposed. Rainbow Creek will receive 4 modulars, leaving space for 2 more in the future. Chestermere High school will receive 2 modulars. At this time, with the exception of Rainbow Creek, all Chestermere schools are now fully built out and any additional modulars will need to be unattached to school property.

A grade and boundary reconfiguration public consultation will take place Oct 22nd in person, with opportunity to share your thoughts online through RVS engage. Details will be provided in a parent letter that will be sent out this week. With the rapid growth in Chestermere and the lack of schools, we need to balance the utilization in our schools in Chestermere.

- There is a lot of new information from finance regarding fundraising, and they school can no longer ask for donations or hold fundraisers for specific things such as field trips.

- PBIS has been in place for the last 2 years, and with the Teachers utilizing the matrix and providing information to students regarding behaviour the school has, overall, seen big improvements.
- Parents feel more connected to school and are pleased with the opportunities to volunteer and participate.
- Literacy marks are up compared to last year.
- Writing assessment results 44% of students are at or above grade level. This will be a new goal for this year.
- This year there will be a new goal scope and sequence from K-6
